

The One Big Beautiful Bill Imposed A \$40,000 SALT Cap That Will Sunset After Five Years And Shrink Back To \$10,000. "The deal is part of President Donald Trump's 'Big Beautiful Bill,' which includes tax cuts, Medicaid reforms and border security funding. Trump's bill passed a key first hurdle in the U.S Senate by a narrow 51-49 vote, and lawmakers are aiming to complete work on the bill this Monday. Under the agreement, the federal government would raise the cap from \$10,000 to \$40,000 on state and local property tax deductions, more commonly called the SALT deduction, for those earning up to \$500,000 a year. Extending the \$10,000 SALT Cap For Five Years Would Cost New Jersey Taxpayers \$30 Billion. According to the Congressional Research Service's summary of H.R. 1 as passed by the House on May 22, 2025, "This section [Sec. 112018] increases the limitation on the federal tax deduction for state and local taxes (commonly known as the SALT deduction cap) to \$40,400 (or \$20,200 for married individuals filing separately). Under this section, the SALT deduction cap is reduced for taxpayers with an adjusted gross income over \$505,000 (or \$202,500 for married individuals filing separately), but not below \$10,000 (or \$5,000 for married individuals filing separately). The section increases the dollar amounts for the limitations on the SALT deduction by 1% per year for tax years 2027-2033 and establishes a permanent limitation for subsequent years that is equal to the 2033 levels." According to Tax Notes, repeal of the SALT cap would in \$6 billion in lower taxes for New Jersey residents in 2021.



The 1995 budget of about \$5.5 million represents an increase of about \$10,000 from last year. However, the municipal tax rate will remain the same at 61.8 cents per \$100 assessed value." I hate it, but there's one thing we should all hate more than taxes, debt, debt in the six and a half years that the governor has been in Trenton, the transportation trust fund debt has gone from nine to 16 billion as of July, 1 of this year, the aggregate gas tax revenue that we produce when we purchase gas does nothing other than make the mortgage payment. So there's no additional money to spend an infrastructure, Mr. President, if you didn't have money to spend on your infrastructure, where would you be running this university? Big trouble. Big trouble. And so I would have been having a different conversation with the people New Jersey over the transportation trust fund. This is a tax that we have not raised since 1988 and over those 30 years. fuel efficiency standards in cars has tripled. We actually collect less gas tax today than we did in 1988 yet through inflation, inflation, what has happened to the cost of the projects, they've gone up. So I know what my liability is, if you will. It's wanting to have a very, very honest dialog with you. I'm not very good at kicking the can down the road. And one of the things that frustrates me most about collective decision making bodies like legislators, legislatures, they will kick the can down the road every single time, every single time, in the hope that some miracle comes along, like an economic boom, or some tobacco settlement where there is lawsuit monies coming to the state in the billions. I don't like to manage that way. I don't like to make extremely important decisions based on assumptions. I want to do what's in the best interest of the state. And sometimes there's a little bit of short term pain. But you know what I find fascinating, when gas was \$4 a gallon, when I first came into the legislature, I didn't get a single call from one of, any one of the 220,000 constituents in my district complaining about Exxon charging you \$4 a gallon. But yet we don't want to seem to have a conversation about a gas tax that would rid us of the crippling debt, improve our infrastructure and put middle class New Jerseyans to work."
